

Welcome to the South Dakota State Fair! In order to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all Fair attendees, please observe the following policies. Please also know that we will enforce these policies as well as [statutes](#) and [rules](#) pertaining to the South Dakota State Fair.

- **Drones:** No unmanned aerial vehicles (UAVs) or drones may be used on the fairgrounds.
- **Pets:** Pets are welcome in the campground, but not allowed anywhere else on the fairgrounds except as part of an exhibit. Pets must be leashed and have all current vaccinations.
- **Tobacco:** The fairgrounds is a tobacco free property.
- **Alcohol:** Alcohol may only be consumed in designated areas.
- **Motorized vehicles:** No motorized vehicles are allowed on the fairgrounds without prior approval. This includes: golf carts, ATVs, 4-wheelers, lawn mowers, hoverboards, and scooters. When using a motorized vehicle on the fairgrounds, please know that pedestrians and livestock have the right of way. Courtesy carts and shuttles are available at all of the gates and throughout the fairgrounds.
- **Non-motorized vehicles:** Certain non-motorized vehicles are also prohibited on the fairgrounds. These include: bicycles, scooters, roller blades, roller skates, and skate boards. Strollers are permitted on the fairgrounds.
- **Parking:** Parking is available on the fairgrounds in designated areas; permits are required. Contact the State Fair office for permit information. Parking in a designated area without the proper pass or parking in non-designated areas may result in your vehicle being towed at the owner's expense.
- **Attire:** Shirts and shoes must be worn in public places on the fairgrounds.
- **Stalling:** Woodchips must be used when stalling horses on the fairgrounds.
- **Feed and Forage:** Feed and forage is available for sale on the fairgrounds from 7am-7pm (Wednesday-Sunday).
- **Service Delivery:** Deliveries may be made prior to 10AM or after 7PM.
- **Feeding and unloading:** A pass is available to allow access to the fairgrounds during designated times to bring in feed for livestock and unload livestock. Passes may be purchased at the State Fair office.
- **Grandstand:** Selfie sticks and professional photography equipment are prohibited in the grandstand.
- **Propane Safety Requirements:** As of April 1, 2002, an Overfilling Prevent Device (OPDs) are required on all propane cylinders between 4 and 40 pounds propane capacity, per the 1998 edition of NFPA 58, Liquefied Petroleum Gas Code. Cylinders of this size manufactured after September 30, 1998, are required to have an OPD. For reference, a typical gas grill cylinder holds about 20 pounds of propane.

After April 1, 2002, propane cylinders not equipped with an OPD must either be retrofitted with the device or properly disposed of and replaced with an OPD-equipped cylinder.

For safety reasons, the Huron Fire Department does periodically drive through the campgrounds. Any camper that has an illegal propane tank will be required to remove it from the fairgrounds immediately. It will be the owner or occupant of the camper's responsibility to remove and properly dispose of the propane tank(s).
