DEPARTMENT 320: EDUCATION EXHIBITS

Exhibits from schoolwork produced during the 2021-2022 school year.

Arts & Education Building: Open 9 AM – 8 PM daily during the fair.

In order for entries to be processed and get the tags back to the schools in adequate time, entries must be in by the April 16 deadline. No exceptions!

INDIVIDUAL TEACHERS SHOULD ACT AS FIRST JUDGE AND ENTER THOSE PROJECTS THAT ARE WORTHY OF THE DISPLAY/COMPETITION AT THE STATE FAIR.

PREPARATION AND SELECTION OF EXHIBITS

- It is important that work represents schoolroom activity throughout the year.
- Individual teachers may enter from their classroom even if the total school does not participate.
- If necessary, mount with any material to make an attractive exhibit keeping in mind the building background is light in color.
- Three dimensional exhibits are encouraged.
- **You may enter up to five exhibits per project. Please do not enter the same project for the entire class. If more than five exhibits per project are entered submissions will be disqualified.**
- All framed entries must be properly prepared for judging and exhibition with adequate hardware/weight wire to ensure safe wall display.
- **When you select art exhibits, take the building's heat and humidity into consideration; exhibits prepared with candies, salt-based clays, non-fired clay, salt, corn syrup, crackers, and dry goods etc. do not reflect the artist's talent by fair time in September.**

ENTERING EXHIBITS

- Upon entry or at the time exhibits are being judged, the superintendent of the Arts & Education Building has the power to determine the eligibility of the exhibit and has the power to bar in her/his best judgment any exhibit from showing if the exhibit is ineligible.
- Each individual school within each independent district will be assigned an entry number by the South Dakota State Fair office upon receipt of the entry form. For example: each grade school, junior high/middle school, and senior high in the district will be assigned an entry number.
- Include the full name and address of school and email address of the person in charge.
- Send the original entry form to the State Fair on or before April 16. No entry forms will be allowed after this date. No exceptions!
- Mount each student's work separately. If the works are mounted together, it will be considered a group project.

If you do not send an exhibit as listed on the original entry form, cross out that exhibit on the duplicate entry sheet (packing slip).

LABELING ENTRY TAGS

Computerized entry tags for each individual exhibit will be mailed out by the South Dakota State Fair upon receipt of your entry on an official education entry blank. Tags will be mailed to the person in charge or the teacher as stated on the entry blank. Mark each exhibit with student's name, school name, and address on the back of each exhibit. Use a fine print pen to print the student's name on the entry tag if not included on entry form. Except for names, do not alter the

tags in any way. New tags will not be made. Artwork entered in the incorrect category will be disqualified. Secure tags to the exhibit in the upper left-hand front corner. Please make the tag even with the edge of the paper. **Claim ticket must be removed. Name should be folded under tab.**

AWARDS

Sweepstakes premiums will be made on the basis of total points:

- Blue Ribbon: 1 Point

DROP OFF/SHIPPING

- Materials must be shipped in strong containers.
- Exhibits should be shipped or delivered to the South Dakota State Fair located at 1060 3rd St. SW, Huron, 57350, so they will arrive **no later than June 7, 2022**. If delivering, call the fair office at 605.353.7340.
- Judging may take place any time after entry deadline. All entries must be in by this date so they may be judged and displayed accordingly.
- Return transportation on all exhibits must be pre-paid.

INSTALLATION

- Exhibits will be displayed by the Education Building personnel.
- Education Building personnel will color code the exhibits according to towns or schools.

DISMANTLING AND RETURN OF EXHIBITS

- Exhibits will be available for pickup Tuesday, September 6, from 3 PM-5 PM or Saturday, September 10, 9 AM-12 PM. If this time does NOT work contact the Superintendent.
- Exhibits will be returned to schools by a school representative. Students should not pick up their own exhibits from the Building Superintendent.
- The fair is not responsible for any exhibits not picked up by Saturday, September 10, 2022. Be sure to make arrangements prior to the fair with the Arts & Education staff if you want your exhibit to be sent back to you by mail, postage must be pre-paid.
- **Artwork is packed by school not individual teachers or grades and should be picked up by one representative.**

TERMINOLOGY

- Original: Work that is from a child's mind; not a copy. There should be no two pieces alike from the same class project.
- Creative: A new construction of existing materials.
- Class Project: The involvement of the entire class in producing one project. The project should be mounted as one unit with one entry tag. Contact the fair office concerning large projects. **Space limitations of approximately 3' x 6'.**
- Small Group Project: The involvement of two or more students producing one project. The project should be mounted as one unit with one entry tag. Contact the fair office concerning large projects. **Space limitations of approximately 3' x 6'.**
- Individual: Project completed by a single student.
